Our founder Daisaku Ikeda delivered a commemorative lecture at Columbia University Teachers College in 1996. Toward the end of the lecture, he proposed four elements to be incorporated in curriculum for global citizenship education as follows:

- Peace education, in which young people learn the cruelty and folly of war, to root the practice of nonviolence in human society

- Environmental education, to study current ecological realities and means of protecting the environment

- Developmental education, to focus attention on issues of poverty and global justice

- Human rights education, to awaken an awareness of human equality and dignity.

Kansai Soka High School explores global issues addressed by the United Nations based on these four themes: environment, development, human rights, and peace, and we implement the leading edge of global citizenship education program to foster sturdy global leaders who contribute to world peace filled with sense of mission, empathy, and creativity for problem solving.
